Call for State Convention Delegates

The State Convention for all AFT – Wisconsin affiliated locals is Oct. 29th – 31st at the Wyndham Milwaukee Airport Hotel and Convention Center in Milwaukee (See the AFT-W event calendar link at the bottom of the second page). While all members are welcome to attend, only delegates are allowed to vote. To become a delegate a member must first be nominated. Dues Increase

First the bad news. A dues increase at the AFT-National level was passed at the national convention this summer. In a previous E-Bulletin issue we let the membership know that WSP would be opposing this increase. We tried to make the argument that everyone needed to tighten their belts in the current economic times. However we are a very small fish (with about 1,000 members) in a very big (millions of members) pond and the dues increase passed overwhelmingly.

The good news is that your Local has been and continues to be fiscally conservative. Due to that, we have enough resources to absorb this dues increase and NOT pass it through to the membership. We will do that for a minimum of 6 months and hopefully longer.

Politics

A national election is coming, and we are all being snowed under by an unbelievable number of mailings to vote for this or that candidate and why. Unfortunately for everyone, current advertising trends indicate that to get a point across to any particular person, you need to present someone with the information a minimum of 8 times. So in the simpler world of our parents, we would be mailed 8 pieces of information about the candidate you should vote for (well actually 16 because the other side's guy would want to make sure that you knew about him also) and we'd be done.

Sadly for you and me the world is not that simple anymore. Now throw the major parties (both State and National) into the mix and you've increased the number of mailings to 48. Add to that AFT-Wisconsin and AFT-N (let's face it the Unions do have an interest in who's in office) and then add WMC, WEAC, and other special interest groups, and before you know it you're getting bushel baskets of campaign material every day.

What has the WSP been doing to help our members get out from under this deluge? Our belief is that members should not get any campaign contacts that you haven't asked for regardless of who it's from. So we are doing what we can to improve your options, by asking the groups we have some influence with to allow you to opt out of getting their mailers. We have seen great improvements in
